

Invalid Codes

Users may come across codes that are invalid and extreme caution should be used before they are used operationally. Examples include codes starting;

US-S1Z... QM-S1Z... QZ-S1Z... JM-K40...

These code families have for many years been used in documentation and training materials. They have never been allocated for assignments by users but may have been used in error. Recordings associated with one of these codes should be checked with the rights owner before the code is accepted by system users.
